




## Ancient Civilization Lesson Plan Set includes:




THE AFRICA SET includes:

**SLAVERY AND THE MIDDLE PASSAGE:** This lesson plan traces the history of the Transatlantic Slave Trade over the course of a 400 year period, detailing the treacherous routes through which slaves were captured in Africa and transported to the New World. The personal horrors and emotional effects of the journey into slavery known as the Middle Passage are recounted through oral histories, rare diaries, authentic recreations, and the commentary of expert historians. Framing the history of African civilizations and people before, during, and after the slave trade, this lesson plan provides students with new insights into the profound effects of enslavement historically, and its legacy in our world today.
